

Accessibility at Sydney Festival 2016

Sydney Festival are committed to ensuring Sydney Festival events are accessible to every member of our audience, including people with a disability and those with accessibility support requirements. There is a broad and complex range of accessibility considerations that the Festival strives to meet, and we remain committed to providing dignified access to our program of events and communications.

In 2016, Sydney Festival has strived to make our program accessible to all through a variety of accessible performance options. This year we are delighted to present an exciting range of Auslan interpreted, captioned, audio described and relaxed performances, as well as a unique sensory installation.

AUDIO DESCRIPTION AND TACTILE TOURS - for audiences who are blind or have low vision

Audio Description is a narration of the visual elements of a live theatre performance via a radio receiver and earpiece. Before the performance starts, the audio describers provide program details together with descriptions of costumes and stage settings. Throughout the work, concise descriptions of actions, expressions and gestures are transmitted during gaps between the dialogue of the on-stage actors.

For patrons who are blind or are vision impaired Sydney Festival will be providing a tactile tour and audio described performance of *The Rabbits*— the Helpmann award winning opera for all ages based on the iconic children's book by John Mardsen with illustrations by Shaun Tan. *The Rabbits* is composed by Kate Miller-Heidke with libretto by award-winning playwright Lally Katz and is directed by John Sheedy.

The tactile tour will provide an exclusive insight into the work with participants being talked through the set, able to examine the costumes and having the opportunity to talk to the creative team, cast and crew involved in the work. The audio described performance of *The Rabbits* provides an additional narration track, where a narrator describes what is happening on stage during natural pauses, allowing visual elements of the work to be shared.

In addition, there will be a tactile tour for the world premiere of *Pleasure Garden*, a site-specific installation in the gardens of Vaucluse House. Music and environmental sounds weave together in this listening garden and active instrument featuring newly composed music by Genevieve Lacey and Jan Bang. A trained audio describer will join with both artist and horticulturalist to present this session.

PRE-SHOW DESCRIPTIONS - for audiences who are blind or have low vision

Pre-show descriptions are verbal descriptions conducted by an audio describer, prior to the performance. The pre-show description begins 30 minutes prior to the performance and provides program details together with descriptions of the stage setting.

Soloists Elise Caluwaerts and Wiard Witholt trace the doomed voyage of mythical lovers Orpheus and Eurydice in Sydney Chamber Opera's production of Pascal Dusapin's *Passion*.

AUSLAN INTERPRETED THEATRE – for Deaf audiences

In 2015, Sydney Festival will present an Auslan interpreted performance of *La Verita* – a surrealist circus from Compagnia Finzi Pasca who combine circus, clowning, acrobatics, dance and music. *La Verita* is inspired by a painting by Salvador Dali, recently discovered in a forgotten box at the back of a New York Theatre and promises to be a thrilling experience with humour and heart.

In The Famous Spiegeltent step into an opulent 19th century Parisian boudoir for the multi-award-winning **Songs For The Fallen**, a party with Paris' original party girl, in a rollicking and romantic cabaret musical, featuring cabaret star Sheridan Harbridge.

An Auslan interpreted performance will make this work accessible to the Deaf community. As the action unfolds on stage, an interpreter stands to one side and signs the text and dialogue live. Audience members who are Deaf are seated in the section nearest to the onstage interpreter to ensure optimum sightlines.

RELAXED PERFORMANCES

Relaxed performances are designed to create a safe and welcoming environment for children on the autism spectrum and people with intellectual disabilities, along with their friends, carers and families. Performances are provided in a casual atmosphere, with a supportive and non-judgemental environment that features slight modifications to sound and lighting, a downloadable pre-visit social story and support aids with an open door policy and quiet area available.

In 2015 Sydney Festival will present two relaxed performances in the Famous Spiegeltent, as part of Family Week.

From Arena Theatre Company and Salvador Dinosaur comes **Sunny Ray and the Magnificent Moon**, a new work featuring original music inspired by everything from folk to funk, disco and pop. Meet Sunny Ray – happy, light, a true wonder of the world; and her best friend, the Magnificent Moon – the all-night party guy. What happens when the sun breaks all the rules and stays up with the moon?

In *Tolu*, the gravity defying troupe from Casus Circus tell a vivaciously fun story told through circus, dance and play. Three friends left to their own devices discover each other's likes, dislikes and soft spots as they twist, flip, spiral, balance, jump and climb.

LIVE THEATRE CAPTIONING - for audiences with hearing impairments

Theatre Captioning is an accurate text display of a theatre performance in its entirety, including actors' dialogue, ad libs, asides, song lyrics, musical descriptions and other sound effects, displayed on large screens at the side of the stage. This entails a trained captioner preparing the captions in advance so that they mirror the rhythm and flow of the actors' dialogue. The captioner then cues the captions live at the performance, where they are displayed on large screens at the side of the stage as the action unfolds.

The major new work from Broome's internationally acclaimed dance-theatre company Marrugeku, *Cut The Sky*, will be captioned. A meditation on humanity's frailty in the face of our own actions, *Cut The Sky* is about our relationship with Country – our past, present and future through an Aboriginal lens in a dynamic fusion of dance, song and poetry.

Canada's Mammalian Diving Reflex (who brought *Haircuts By Children* to Sydney Festival in 2013) are back with a brilliant new social collaboration, *All The Sex I've Ever Had*. A group of Sydney's over-65s draw on all their experience to share true stories of their romantic and sex lives in a taboo-busting tell-all where the spotlight is at last shone on those often rendered invisible.

Also captioned will be the new Australian Opera, *The Rabbits*, the Helpmann Award-winning opera for children and families composed by and starring Kate Miller-Heidke and based on John Marsden and Shaun Tan's haunting picture book.
