The Meriton Festival Village returns to Hyde Park for its third year with more than double its free entertainment offerings. While the Magic Mirrors Spiegeltent still plays home to a range of ticketed cabaret, music and comedy events, the village's new outdoor stage will host 21 days of free festival fun.

Hosted by the ebullient **Bob Downe** (aka **Mark Trevorrow**) and with more wigs than you can poke a curling wand at, *The Hair Salon* features *The Big Hair Show* – a cross-between Kath & Kim and Steel Magnolias with a touch of Hair Spray, created especially for the Sydney Festival Village, featuring a heady mix of cabaret, colour enhanced acrobatics, dance, music and special Sydney Festival guest artists. *The Perm Set* – a live music program featuring and amazing line up of Sydney's disco, soul, funk, and latin bands, and Spanish hair sculptors **Osadia**: incredible art performance hairdressers from Barcelona who create sensational hair sculptures on volunteers from the audience.

The *Orszaczky Budget Orchestra* will play a loving tribute to one of the most beloved and influential figures in Australian music. A crack team of his collaborators including singer and partner, **Tina Harrod** & bass-player **Dave Symes** (Prop, Boy & Bear) will channel the funk & soul fuelled energy of Orszaczky's iconic Tuesday night residencies.

A one-off, special event and a call-back to 2016's impromptu explosion of dancing in the Village to remember the music of the original Rocketman: *Let's Dance* celebrates the life of David Bowie with an evening of DJs, dancing and public participation inspired by the video-clip that was shot in Sydney in 1983.

Saturday afternoon around the Archibald Fountain, *Roller Jam* will be a roller-disco in the round. Sydney Festival is calling on all roller skaters of any age to strap on a pair of skates to glide, boogie and shake. For those of you without wheels, find a spot on the lawn around the skate circle and take in the tunes as the roller-skaters whirl around one of Sydney's iconic landmarks.

For the younger participants, please remember to bring your safety gear. All children under 14 must wear a helmet to participate. Full skater guidelines and more information will be available closer to the event.
