# Lubomyr Melnyk

**Lubomyr Melnyk** is the fastest pianist in the world – Guinness world record verified. He can play nearly twenty notes per second, a near-overwhelming but perfectly controlled roil that blurs into a gorgeously cohesive whole.

Lauded for his ability to create a symphony of sound with a single instrument, Melnyk has spent 40 years developing his unique piano technique. Described as ‘continuous music’, the style combines the soaring density of post-rock and the virtuosic delicacy of minimal-classical. What results is a meditative, mind-bending cloud of abstract sound, with clear emotions and images appearing out of the pointillist flurry.

Lubomyr Melnyk’s music was born of hunger — not dramatic, existential hunger, but actual, physical starvation. At the time, in the 1970s, Melnyk was a young Ukrainian-Canadian musician living in Paris, a budding pianist and an admirer of **Terry Riley** and **John McLaughlin**. Often, he says, he went days without eating and lived in the streets sometimes. At one point, though, he found work as a janitor at the Paris Opera, which is where he met dancer **Carolyn Carlson**. Carlson had heard of Melnyk’s piano playing and asked him to score a piece she was choreographing. He sat down at the piano and found the music.

The piano technique is based on extremely rapid notes and complex note-series, usually with the sustain pedal held down to generate overtones and sympathetic resonances. These overtones blend or clash according to harmonic changes. The rapid sequences, coupled with Melnyk’s awe-inspiring ability of playing up to 19 notes per second with each hand simultaneously create a tapestry of sound that transcends sonic waves into a physical experience. Most of his music is for piano, but he has also composed chamber and orchestral works.

Off the back of a record deal with Erased Tapes (alongside fellow artists **Ólafur Arnalds** and **Nils Frahm**), Melnyk is finally playing shows to breathless audiences in sold-out spaces.
