## Wesley Enoch (Artistic Director, Sydney Festival)

Wesley Enoch is the Director of the Sydney Festival. He has been a theatre director/writer for over 25 years specialising in Aboriginal Theatre. Wesley was Artistic Director of Queensland Theatre Company 2010–15, Ilbijerri 2003–06 and Kooemba Jdarra 1994–97, and Resident Director at Sydney Theatre Company 2000–01, Associate Artistic Director Company B Belvoir 2007–10, and worked on the Opening Ceremony of the 2006 Commonwealth Games. Wesley has worked with all the large theatre companies, arts centres and festivals in Australia and won multiple awards. Wesley was a Trustee of the Sydney Opera House 2006–13 and is the Chair of the ATSI Strategy Panel for the Australia Council.

# Jonnine Standish (Ghost Train, HTRK)

Jonnine Standish is an acclaimed art director and musician. She is best known as one-half of the lauded minimal electronic duo, HTRK, and is currently the creative director for M/FW (Melbourne Fashion Week). Jonnine conceptualises multimedia artwork spaces. She is the creative director, in partnership with filmmaker Jasmin Tarasin, for the virtual reality ride *Ghost Train.* She also is the creative director of M\*Sync, for Melbourne's MPavilion.

Jonnine has over a decade of work as the singer and co-producer of the band HTRK, formed in Melbourne in 2003 as the trio of vocalist Jonnine Standish, bassist Sean Stewart (d.2010) and guitarist Nigel Yang. After six years in London, Standish and Yang returned to Australia in 2012. They have produced three critically-acclaimed studio albums for electronic labels Ghostly International and Blastfirstpetite.
