DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Set in the future and drawing on our past, *The Last Season* is made up of the old and the new and explores how we got where we are today. Old ideas and attitudes clashing with new ways of thinking and moving forward – we are in a tug of war.

The Last Season is inspired by Vivaldi's famous work Four Seasons and uses the framework of a continuous four-part cycle. Composed at the start of the second agricultural revolution, Vivaldi's music masterpiece was considered revolutionary in form and concept at the time. Three centuries later it endures.

Perhaps Vivaldi could foresee the great changes that would be brought about by the revolution. Today, his work feels like a message to future generations to remind us that change is constant and cyclical. The music reminds us of a world that once existed but is rapidly disappearing before our eyes.

For generations, children have been led to believe that the kind of idyllic world in Vivaldi's *Four Seasons* still exists. The music depicts this, it wants to believe in this idea. But when the music stops, young people are confronted by a bleak reality. The deception is exposed. They realise that we may never return to eden.
