#### **ABOUT THE SHOW**

Katma is an immersive and soulful exploration of dance, blending street, club and Afro dance forms. It delves into social dance elements like "stalking", a house dance tradition, and the cypher, a space for exchanging, releasing, sharing, connecting, expressing, celebrating and innovating. Drawing from the raw energy of underground parties, Katma captures the intensity and freedom of movement, where music and community come together in unrepeatable moments. In Sudanese slang, "katma" means "suffocation" or "no room for breathing", reflecting the overwhelming, electrifying feeling of being fully immersed in the experience. Directed by Azzam Mohamed, performed and co-created with Robin Chen, Isabella Solisa, Genifer Navuzi, Angelica Osuji, Naethiel Lumbera and Molonai Makalio, Katma invites the audience to simply be in the moment, without expectation.

## A NOTE FROM THE CREATOR

I learned how to dance in the best school I could imagine: the parties. I never studied dance formally, but those times on crowded dance floors were where I discovered rhythm, movement and connection. The music, the people and the energy in those spaces taught me about culture, expression and community. It wasn't just about the moves but about what the music made you feel and how it brought people together.

This work is deeply personal. It's incredible to bring something that grew in underground spaces into the spotlight of one of the world's biggest stages. Collaborating with friends and community members to co-create this piece is a celebration of everything and everyone who shaped us: the DJs who fed our souls, the promoters who curated unforgettable nights, the venues that gave us a home and every dancer who taught us a move, made us smile or shared a moment in a cypher.



As Archie Burnett said, "To 'check your body at the door' means to leave all baggage at the door and to enjoy one's self to the fullest." I hope *Katma* invites you to do just that – immerse yourself in the music, the energy, the people and the dance. Let's celebrate together.
